I was on the faculty from 1967 - the year St. Procopius Academy for boys and Sacred Heart Academy for girls merged - until 2005. I applied my degree in Home Economics earned at St. Benedict's College and my Master's Degree in Religious Education earned at Loyola University. It has been my privilege to serve on the Board of Directors since 1979. Part of that role is as liaison between Benet and Sacred Heart Monastery.

I've witnessed and admired the wisdom, professionalism, and vision of the school's board, faculty, administration, and staff over the decades. The Academy owes its stellar reputation to their dedication to excellence, and to the devotion of all our Redwing families.

And - critically important - the school cannot thrive without the ongoing support of the Village of Lisle. It allows Benet to be a school that Lisle can proudly boast having, a school that attracts families to Lisle.

Our Leadership understands the importance of investing in facilities. In more recent history a second larger gym, a science building, a fine arts building, a modern library, a welcome center, and a hall of fame corridor are some of the capital improvements that attract and benefit students. It is in the Village's best interest for Benet to remain competitive. You should know that growing and operating in a manner that is respectful of our neighbors is not only a high priority, it is one of our Benedictine charisms. The bordering Oak Hill subdivisions were developed in the late 1970s and early 1980s. The residents deserve the enjoyment of their homes in the context of living by a vibrant school. We hope they will take advantage of the new facilities and come out to enjoy the games!
